



## Sogetsu School "Ikebana" x "Zen", elegant, solemn and special experience

The setting is an ancient temple deep in the mountains associated with Zen master Dogen. The participants will take zazen meditation, enjoy Unsui's handmade vegetarian cuisine, and work on ikebana forms in a gorgeous and dynamic way using natural materials from the satoyama, expressing the sense of awe and gratitude that lives in this region. You will also have the opportunity to meet the brewer at the brewery of the sake brewed under the authority of Daihonzan Eihei-ji and enjoy a special kaiseki meal called 'Kyoku' at a long-established onsen ryokan (Japanese hot spring).

Schedule	<p>The following model plan for 3 days and 2 nights can be tailor-made to suit your needs.</p> <p>Day 1] Tokyo Station → Fukui Station → Eihei-ji Temple → Yoshimine-ji Temple → Kakuchi exchange with the brewer at Tanabe Sake Brewery, the official supplier to Eihei-ji Temple → Awara Onsen "Beniya" overnight stay, 'Kyoku' Kaiseki [Day 2] → Via Echizen Kaigan → Exchange and meeting with staff at Sogetsu Tobo → Visit Satoyama and cut out materials → Lunch → Zen and ikebana formations at Yoshimine-ji Temple → "Hakuju-kan" overnight stay in front of Eihei-ji Temple [Day3] Zen meditation and ikebana modeling at Yoshimine-ji Temple → Zen meditation and ikebana modeling at Yoshimine-ji Temple → Fukui Station → Tokyo Station.</p>	The 'Kiwami' kaiseki course is mainly made with crab during the Echizen Gani crab fishing season, while the rest of the year it makes the most of the seafood that only Fukui can offer. Lunch on the second day is a set meal of Echizen soba noodles at Maruoka Castle.
