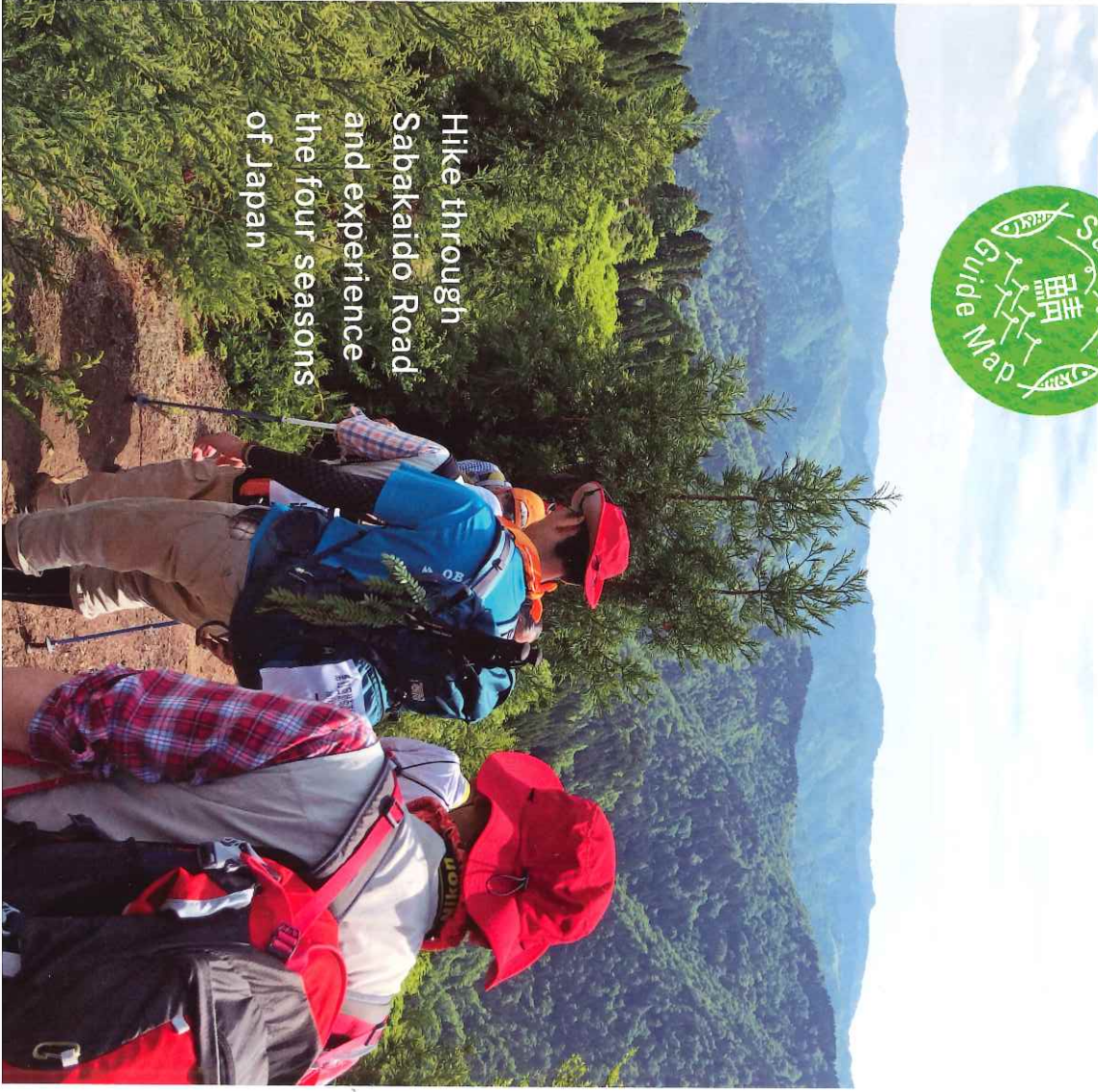


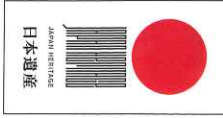

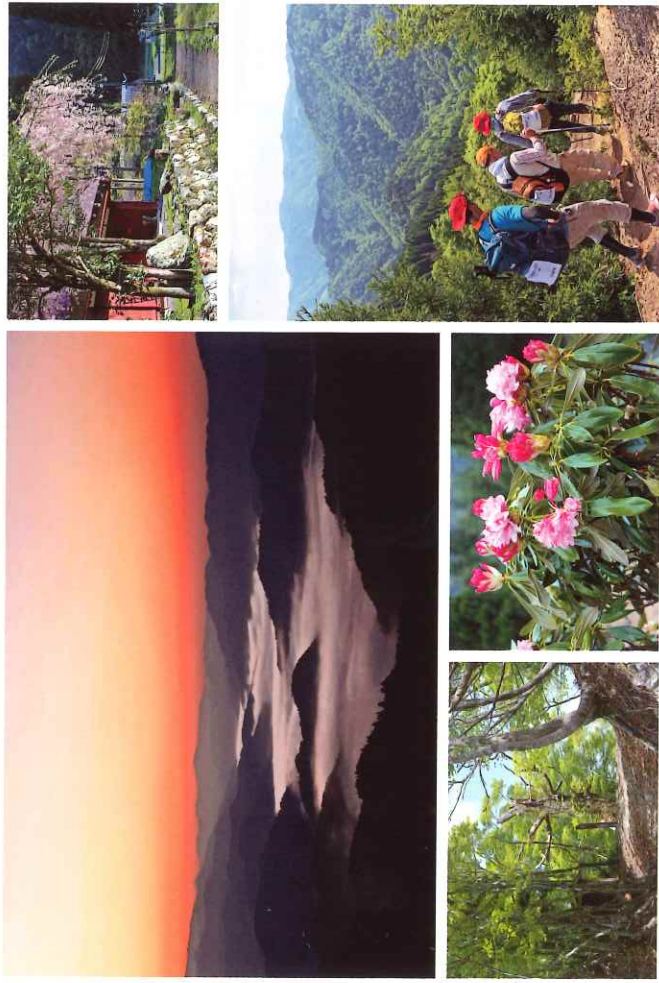
From Obama to Kyoto SABAKAIDO ROAD GUIDE MAP

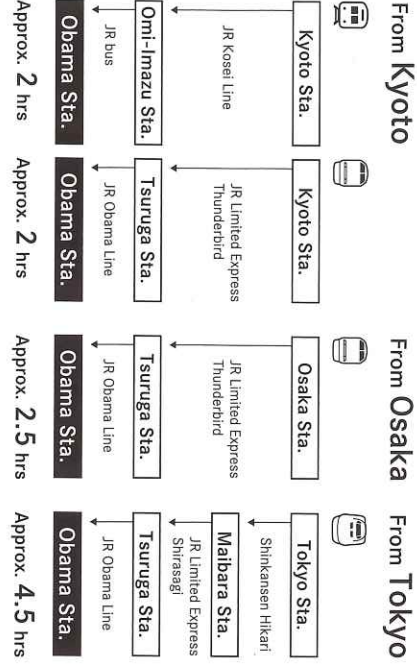

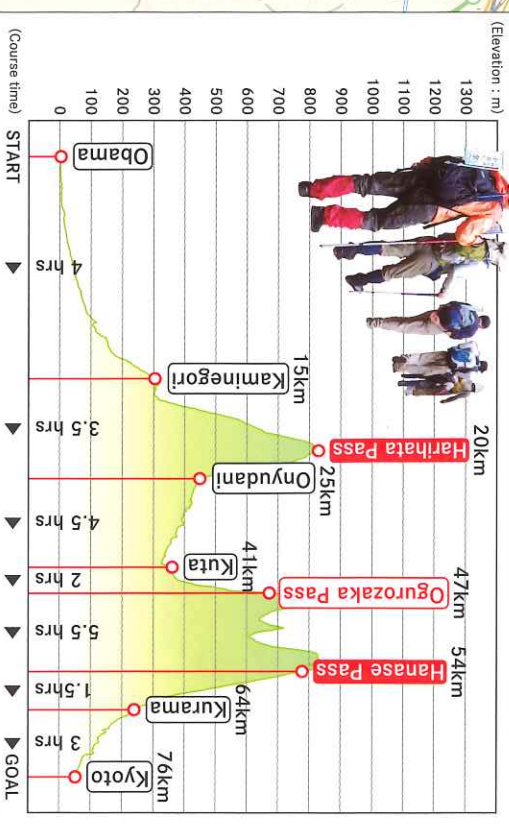
