



#### Cherry Blossoms along the Asuwa River (Asuwa River Embankment)

The Asuwa River runs through central Fukui City, and roughly 600 cherry blossoms line its bank for about 2.2 km. During cherry blossom season, there are also food stalls around, making it a popular place for locals and visitors to hang out and enjoy the scenery.



Enjoy cherry blossoms and azaleas in spring, as well as beautiful autumn colors. The park also features the Nishiyama Zoo — famous for its red pandas — as well as large grassy spaces, play equipment, and a Japanese garden. Located next to the Nishiyama Park Roadside Station.



#### Maruoka Castle

National Castle
A Nationally Designated Important Cultural
Property, and one of only twelve castles with
extant castle towers nationwide. It was destroyed
in the catastrophic 1948 Fukui earthquake, but
through the passionate efforts of locals, it was miraculously rebuilt in less than seven years.

## Heisenji Hakusan Shrine

This was once a vast religious capital, built as a center for faith in Mt. Hakusan. Today, it is often nicknamed "moss temple" or "moss shrine" due to the layer of moss covering the grounds, which gives it an otherworldly feel. The approach to the shrine was selected as one of Japan's 100 Finest Paths.

### Echizen Ono Castle

Originally built for Kanamori Nagachika, a vassal of the first "great unifier of Japan," Oda Nobunaga. The exhibits inside include articles that belonged to the feudal lords who lived in the castle. When the weather conditions are just right, the castle can sometimes be surrounded by a "sea of clouds' in early mornings from October through late April.

Ichijodani Asakura Clan Ruins The former site of a castle town developed based on

pre-planned designs by the Asakura Clan, who were warlords during the Warring States period. The family ruled Echizen from here for 103 years, across five generations.


### Okamoto & Otaki Shrines

Echizen Washi Village has 1,500 years of history as a center of paper production, and these shrines are dedicated to Kawakami Gozen, the legendary goddess said to have first revealed the secrets of making paper. The two shrines share "Japan's most complex roof" — a distinctive and beautifully layered cascade of curves and peaks.

## Kehi Jingu Shrine

The guardian shrine of the old Hokuriku-do region In guardian shime of the on nokumu-do region (present-day Fukui, Ishikawa, Toyama, and Niigata Prefectures), dedicated to seven deities. ## Myotsuji Temple

Myotsuji is one of the Eight Temples of Obama, said to have been established by the eighth-century court noble and general Sakanoue no Tamuramaro. The temple's main hall and three-tiered pagoda are both designated National Treasures.






